Carbon Dioxide Removal (CDR) is increasingly recognized as a key strategy in the fight against climate change. However, it also fuels debates in councils and academia about its effectiveness and potential to undermine focus from mitigation and adaptation strategies.

With the urgent goal of achieving net-zero emissions, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has projected the need to remove 5-16 billion metric tons of carbon annually by 2050. It is time to unpack this critical issue.
